Djordjija Petkoski is the head of the Business, Competitiveness, and Development team, WBI at the World Bank. Since joining the World Bank in 1992, he has focused on competitiveness and sustainable development, corporate responsibility, ethics and anti-corruption, corporate governance, leadership and leading change, with work experience in Asia, Latin America, the former Soviet Union, Eastern Europe, and Africa.

Mr. Petkoski is serving on the Academic Advisory Board of the Carol and Lawrence Zicklin Center for Business Ethics Research, the Wharton School, and is a member of the Private and Public, Scientific, Academic, and Consumer Food Policy Committee at Harvard University. He was a Fulbright Visiting Scholar at Harvard University in the early 1990's and a Visiting Scholar at Massachusetts Institute of Technology from 1979-80. Mr. Petkoski is author or co-author of 15 books and over 120 articles. He has delivered lectures at leading universities and international organizations around the world. He co-teaches a course on Corporate Responsibility and Ethics at Wharton Business School. He has a MPA degree from Harvard University, a Ph.D. in economics from the University of Zagreb, and a Ph.D. in electrical engineering from the University of Belgrade.
